IS THAT AIRPLANE LANDING ON MY ROOF?

Community concern and outrage about the new NextGen flight path technology is literally sweeping the country as the FAA installs NextGen in city after city.

Issues that concern residents affected by the new airplane flight paths include noise, vibration, pollution, loss of property values, etc. Lawsuits have been filed against the FAA in Phoenix, Chicago, Queens (NY), and San Francisco, and others are sure to follow.

The recent SoCal Metroplex Project draft environmental assessment concluded that there is no negative noise impact from the planes we hear and see overhead every day . . . but **there has been no on-site or on-the-ground measurement of sound.**

We residents can testify to the noise impacts!
