INLAND TRAIL PROGRESS



SANDAG crews made significant progress on three miles of the Inland Rail Trail over the last several months. Recent construction activities included trail paving, light installation, fence installation, and landscaping. These three miles of the Inland Rail Trail travel through unincorporated San Diego County and the City of Vista and are anticipated to open to the public this summer.

When this phase opens, there will be more than 10 miles of continuous trail open between the Escondido Transit Center and Mar Vista Drive in the City of Vista, helping provide a complete corridor in North County.

The **June 20th clean-up event** looks very different this year. It will transition to a remote and virtual cleanup. There will be no official hosted sites for this event. Volunteers will clean up only as individual households around their block. Here's what is planned for the June 20th clean up event:

- Registration is now open at CreektoBay.org.
- All participants are encouraged to register online as a volunteer. Then, tune into the event kick-off at 9 a.m. on June 20 at [the I Love A Clean San Diego Facebook page](#). The kick-off will provide important volunteer and safety information.
- I Love A Clean San Diego provides the [Volunteer Impact Map](#). This participatory map allows volunteers countywide to submit their cleanup location.
- Creek to Bay typically runs for three hours, 9 a.m. to noon. However, volunteers are able to participate anytime during the day.

The 2020 Census will determine congressional representation, inform hundreds of billions in federal funding every year, and provide data that will impact communities for the next decade.

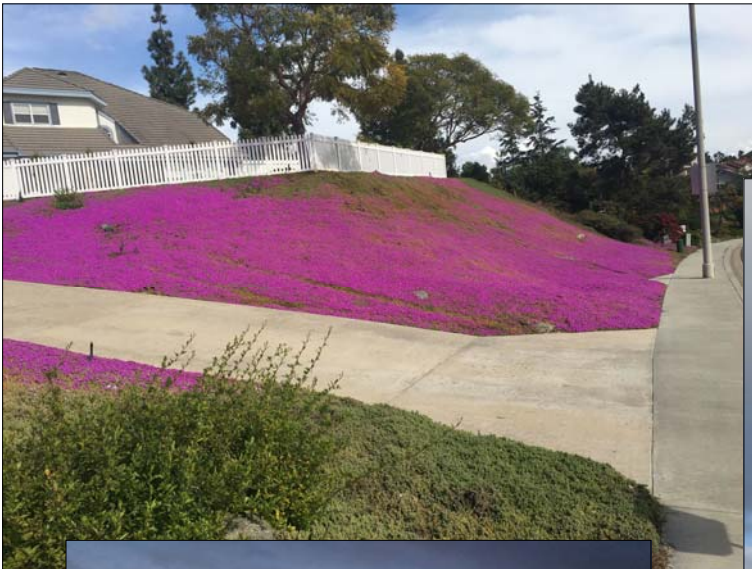


**JUNE 20 — A NEW KIND OF

Simple Things To Do to Prevent Irrigation Runoff

INSPECT
Check irrigation system for broken lines/sprinkler heads, replace if necessary

ADJUST SPRINKLERS
Adjust sprinklers to prevent over-spray onto sidewalks and streets

COVER SLOPES
Cover slopes with plants or mulch to prevent dirt from eroding

TAKE A SPRINKLER BREAK
Check frequency/duration of irrigation system to prevent overwatering

STORE SAFELY
Store pesticides, fertilizers, other chemicals in a covered area

MINIMIZE
Minimize use of pesticides, fertilizer, other chemicals
