Preliminary Review of Proposed General Plan Amendment and Zone Change at 1205 Melrose Way

The applicant's proposal includes a request to develop the site with 15 single-family lots, which would require a General Plan Amendment, Zone Change, and Tentative Subdivision Map with a Density Bonus. The current zoning allows five single-family lots.

You're having a medical emergency and cannot speak on the phone

Enter the numbers 911 in the "To" field



Give the location and nature of your emergency



Respond to any questions and follow instructions

Message and data rates may apply. Do not use emojis, abbreviations and acronyms. Photos and videos cannot be sent to 9-1-1. Messages sent to 9-1-1 cannot include other people.

TOO TOXIC TO TRASH

SAFE DISPOSAL IS EASY TO DO AND MAKES A BIG IMPACT



Household products like paint, cleaners, fertilizers/ pesticides, or other household items can hurt people, fish and wildlife, if incorrectly disposed of, especially if poured down storm drains or sinks.

- Dispose of oil, paint, batteries, other chemicals at the City of Vista's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility
- Clean paint brushes, buckets, rags where waste can be contained e.g. portable container, then properly dispose
- Don't place wet paint in the trash bin
