It's been my honor to serve you for 8 years. Here's the work I'd like to continue as Mayor:

-<u>Homelessness</u>

I called for the creation of Vista's Homelessness Strategic Plan. We secured shelter, fielded social

workers, and 289 homeless Vistans have been offered help in more than 1,915 interactions. I cast the deciding vote to bring mental health crisis services to Vista, and I led the way again on a plan to end Veteran homelessness in Vista for good.

-A Safer, Cleaner Vista

Crime is at a 40-year low, but not low enough. I kept my promise to hire more Sheriff's deputies and firefighters. I built a partnership with CalTrans to bring encampment clean-up to our freeway ramps. Doubling Vista's litter removal team was my initiative, as was the Downtown Ambassador Program. Our new Community Improvement Team is focused on shopping cart and debris removal, another initiative of mine.

-Cost of Living and Smart Growth

We must provide affordable housing opportunities for our own children to afford to live in Vista. We should reject ultra-high-density developments, however, which burden our schools and create traffic congestion. Our families $Cont. P. 3 \rightarrow$

LOCATION

A proposal by Zoran Djordjevic, Pacific International Investments, for a zone change from low density to medium density to allow 15 housing lots (1 lot for low-income house) was unanimously denied by the Planning Commission on July 19.

Among the concerns, which SVC shares, were the large increase in density, increased traffic, decreased value of neighboring property, and incompatibility with current neighborhood style. Also, additional dwelling units (ADUs) can be built on the lots, further increasing density.

On August 23, notwithstanding these concerns, the City Council approved the project, 4–1.

FOR TUESDAY'S PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING

Recent articles in the *Union-Tribune* have described changes in zoning and design standards mandated by new State laws Senate Bill 9 and Senate Bill 330. A *whole lot* of change is coming to the design and appearance of our communities.

The Planning Commission meeting **next Tues-day, September 6 (6:00 p.m.)** will be devoted to presenting the scope of these changes: urban lot splits, zoning clearances, two-unit residential developments, and new design standards for multifamily and mixed-use development projects.

Also can you please share with your community this flight tracking tool: https://globe.adsbexchange.com/

Just shift the map over (across the US) to your neighborhood and bookmark it. Unlike webtrak, pilots cannot mask their ID. If you click on a plane, there is a left tab that gives you an identifier, who it is registered to, their altitude, squawk, etc. There is even a replay function. The best part, it is completely free!
